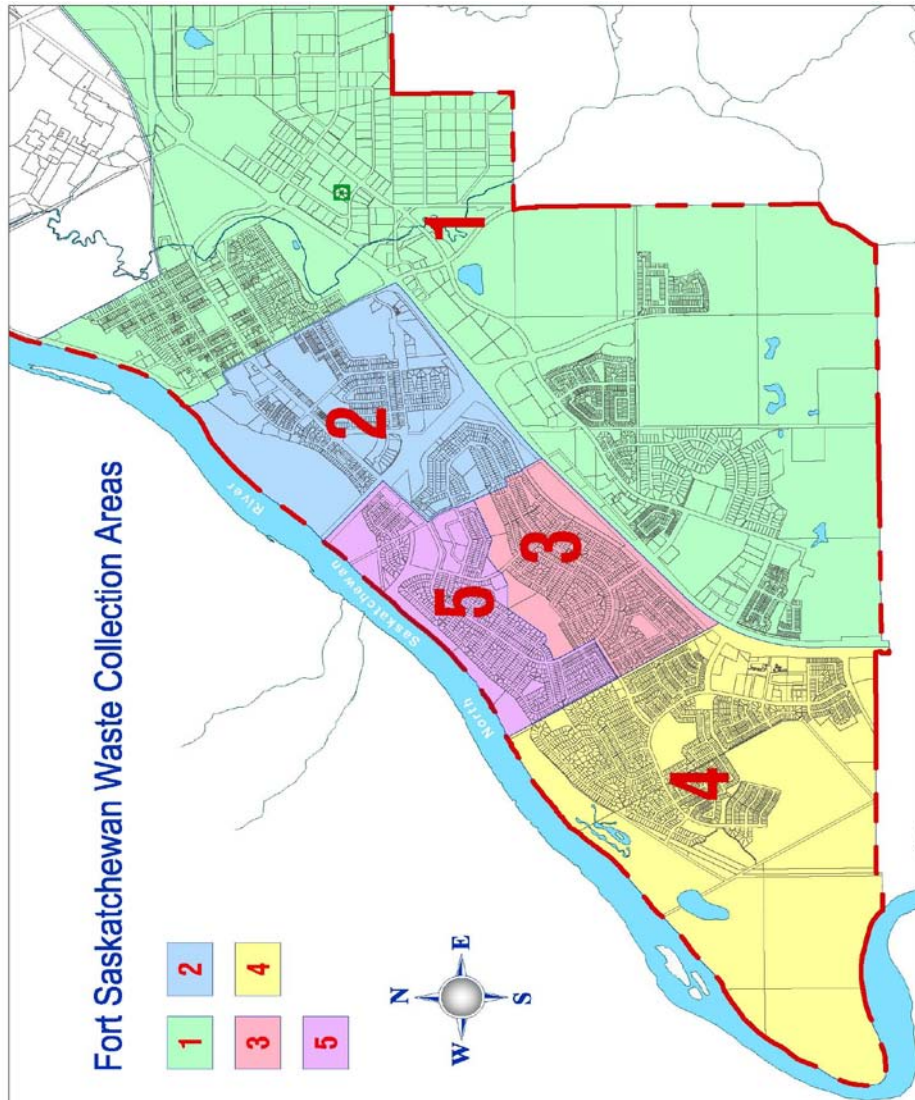


AREA MAP

HOW TO USE YOUR GARBAGE CALENDAR

- 1) Refer to the map on the back page.
- 2) Find the area your house is located in.
- 3) That area will contain an area number and color.
- 4) That area number and color represents your area.
- 5) Find your area number and color on the calendar.
- 6) That will be your collection day.

WASTE & RECYCLING COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Waste and recycling collection is provided on a five-day rotating schedule. Your collection day will change after each statutory holiday.

WHAT IS BLUE BAG CO-MINGLED RECYCLING?

- ✓ Blue bag recycling is easy to do with no sorting required! Just place your clean recyclables into blue transparent plastic bags and set them out for collection on your scheduled garbage collection day, two feet away from regular garbage.
- ⊘ Do not use green or black garbage bags or any other containers for recycled products because they will be collected as regular garbage and disposed of at the landfill.

What items ARE acceptable for recycling?

Paper

Newspapers and inserts, magazines, catalogues, writing paper, computer paper, cards, junk mail, paper bags, envelopes, paper back & hard covered books (remove hard covers), phone books and paper egg cartons. Place shredded paper in a separate bag.



Cardboard



Flattened, corrugated cardboard boxes, cereal and food boxes (remove and discard liner), milk cartons (rinse & flatten), shoe boxes, brown paper bags and juice boxes. Large cardboard must be cut to 3 to 4 foot lengths and tied with a string.

What items are NOT acceptable for recycling?

Recycled product is taken to a certified recycling processor.



Metals - no loose lids - trap inside can or discard

Clean tin cans (soup, juice, etc), aluminum containers (pie plates) & aluminum cans (beverages).

Glass - empty, clean & discard lids - labels are okay

Jars and bottles only. Examples: Pickle, Jam, Ketchup & Beverage. No other type of glass is acceptable.

Plastics - discard caps and lids - empty, rinse & squish

Household cleaner bottles, pop and beverage bottles, detergent or fabric softener bottles, plastic bags, milk jugs, margarine and yogurt containers. Make sure the plastic displays the recycle symbol.

CONTAMINATION

Contamination is serious. If a bag contains non-recyclable materials, the bag will be disposed of at the landfill.

ON YOUR COLLECTION DAY

- 1 Place waste out for collection by 7:00 am. Daily collection times may vary from week to week.
- 2 Ensure your waste is located adjacent to the curb.
- 3 Place your co-mingled recycled product a minimum of 2 feet away from your garbage.
- 4 Park your vehicles away from pickup locations along roads and lanes.
- 5 Make sure the waste is visible to the driver and there is clear access to the waste containers.
- 6 The driver is required to complete his route each day. More waste may mean a later daily collection time.



GENERAL WASTE DISPOSAL INFORMATION

- ✓ Household refuse must be contained in plastic garbage bags or cans. Please do not overfill.
- ✓ Filled containers should weigh no more than 22.7 kg (50 lbs).
- ✓ Leaves and grass clippings can be disposed of at the Recycling Station, located at 8609 - 111 Street.
- ✓ Large household items may be disposed of at the Transfer Station during regular hours of operation.
- ✓ Carpet and clippings from trees and shrubs will be picked up only if tied in bundles no longer than 1.2 meters (4 feet). You can also bring them to the Transfer Station, located at 8609 - 111 Street.
- ✓ Trees, shrubs & branches may be disposed of at the Transfer Station during regular hours of operation.

WASTE TRANSFER STATION 8609 - 111 STREET



The Recycle Station will continue to be open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for all regular household recyclables such as paper, plastics, milk jugs, grass clippings, cardboard, glass, newspaper and tin. For all other waste, please refer to the Waste Transfer Station information shown below.

PRODUCT EXCHANGE CENTRE

- ✓ Items being left will be at the discretion of the attendant.
- ✓ All items must work and be in good condition
- ⊘ No furniture unless approved by the attendant
- ⊘ No mattresses
- ⊘ No toilets
- ⊘ No tires
- ⊘ No bikes or metal or steel products that can be placed in the recycled white goods section.

Household waste - residents & non-residents

Metals & white goods

- ✓ Appliances and scrap metal - no charge

Mattress & box spring

- ✓ Per item charges apply

Furniture: sofa, loveseat, chair & other furniture

- ✓ Per item charges apply

Electronic waste - no charge for the following:

Christmas tree collection (by City staff on your regular garbage day) **January 3 - January 16, 2012**

Household Toxic Round-Up (City Shop Yard: 10 am - 3:00 pm) **June 2, 2012**

Ant and rodent killers, weed killers, pesticides, pool chemicals, toilet, drain and tile cleaners, battery acid, gasoline, rust inhibitors, removers, motor oil, brake and transmission fluid, septic tank cleaners, drain and window cleaners, disinfectants, oven cleaners, bleach, ammonia, cleaning solvents, spot removers, paint, paint thinners and strippers, solvents, lacquers, stains, varnishes, wood preservers, asphalt, roof tar, propane bottles, car and household batteries, health care products, antifreeze, and solvents.

Note: Household and car batteries, propane bottles, paint, anti-freeze and motor oil are accepted at the Transfer Station year round during regular Transfer Station hours.
