

Census Results 2013



Introduction

The 2013 Municipal Census was conducted by the City of Fort Saskatchewan, Corporate Services Division, Legislative Services Department.

This report provides data collected between April 15, 2013 and June 19, 2013 on the number of residents in the home, the age and gender of each, employment status, employment location, and length of residence in this municipality as well as other information. Methods

Under the supervision of the Legislative Services Department of the Corporate Services Division, residents were able to complete the census online.

Enumerators only visited households that did not submit an electronic census by May 6, 2013 and entered the information electronically right at their door. The City contracted the City of Airdrie to host the online 2013 municipal census.

This report presents the results of the census in tables and figures. Where possible, census data from 2012, 2010, 2009 and 2008 are provided for comparison and to identify population trends.

Results

Total Population

The total population of Fort Saskatchewan as of April 15, 2013 was 21,795 (Table 1). This includes 595 residents of the Fort Saskatchewan Correctional Centre. The population increased by 1,320 residents from 2013 to 2012, which represents an increase of 6.45 percent (Table 2).

Population by Gender

The proportion of males in Fort Saskatchewan has decreased over the past two years. In 2013, 50.7 percent of the population is male, while 47.6 percent is female (Table 3).


Population by Age and Gender

Dwelling Type

Single detached houses remain the predominant type of dwelling in Fort Saskatchewan (Table 8). The proportion of single detached, apartment, and tri/quadraplex are all showing an increase since 2012. Vacant dwellings were recorded at 375 and there was a total of 273 no responses for this question.

Employment Status


The Employment Status results show that 45.3 % of respondents are employed full time and that Fort Saskatchewan has a 1.6% unemployment rate.

Figure 2. Employment status







Figure 3. Employment status by gender

Figure 5. Employment location




Figure 6. Employment location by gender




The 2013 Census included a question on the length of residency within Fort Saskatchewan showing 32.6 % of respondents have lived here 10 years or longer.

Figure 7. Length of residency






Figure 8. Length of residency by gender




Figure 9. Length of residency by age

Figure 10. Level of education




Figure 11. Level of Education by gender






Figure 13. Language spoken at home







Figure 14. Language spoken at home by gender


This is a new question for the 2013 Census and 2,700 responses were recorded as the Fort Record as the local news source with 4,636 providing no response for this question.

Figure 16. Local News Source







Figure 17. Local News Source by Gender








Figure 22. Population by enumeration area (708-908)
