❖ The Fort Saskatchewan Detachment has 24 Hour policing available to the community.

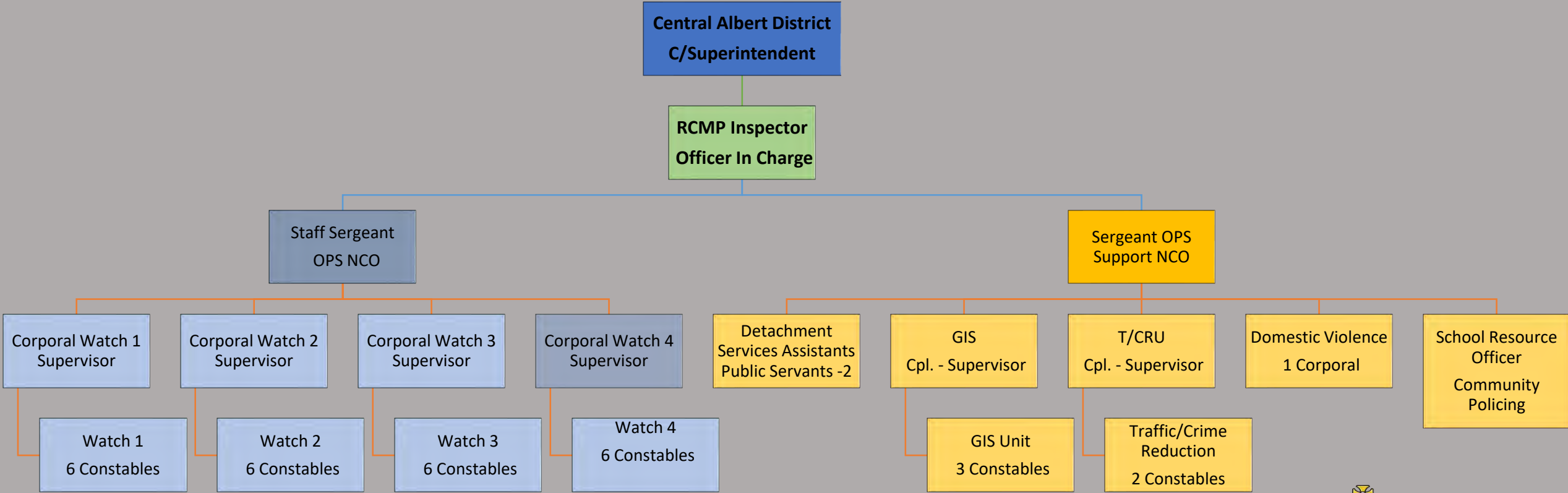

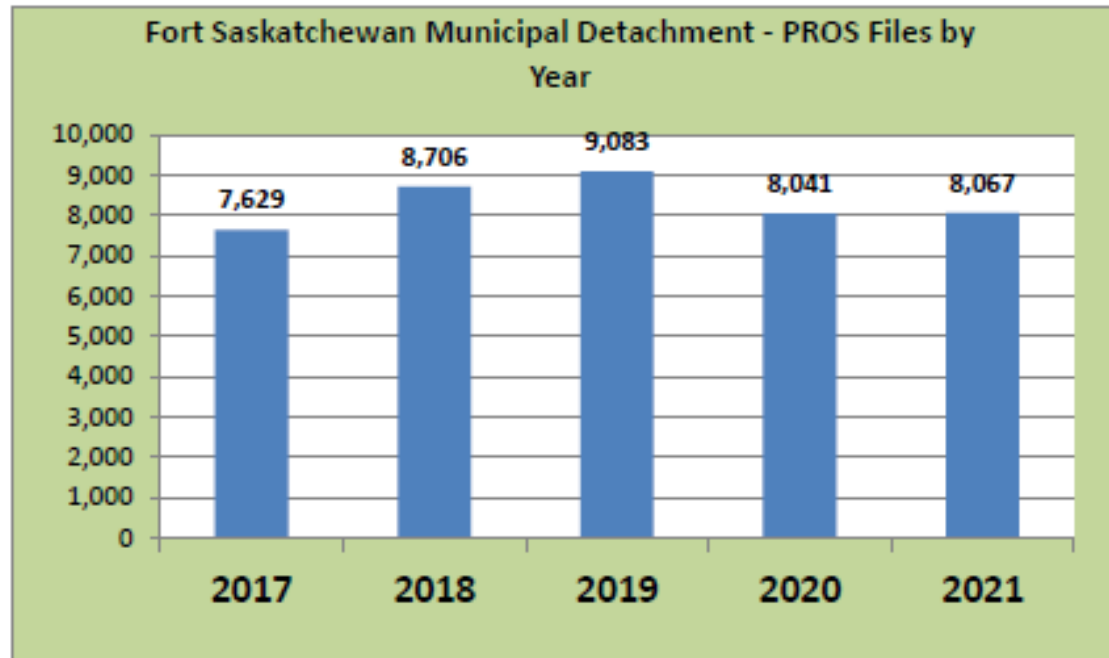
Detachment Boundaries

City of Fort Saskatchewan, Bruderheim, Lamont, Lamont County, Chipman and Elk Island Park



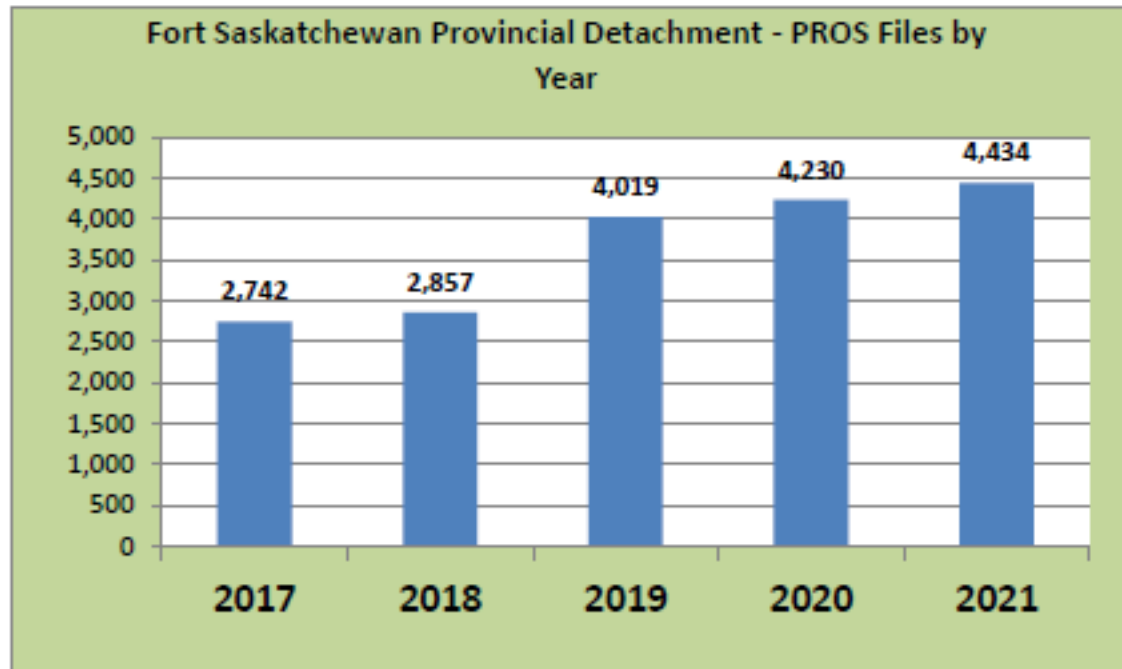


Municipal Jurisdiction – Crime Stats

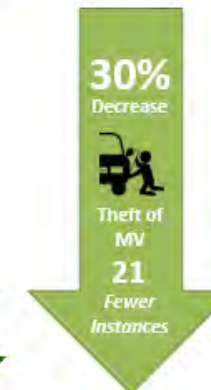

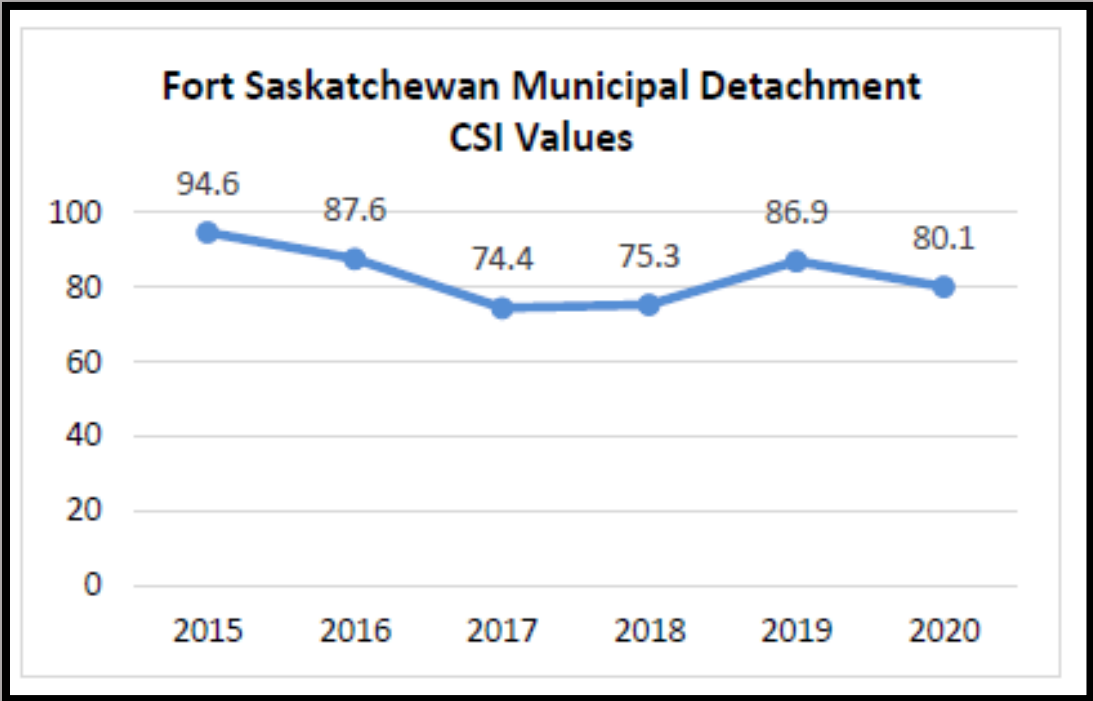




Crime Severity Index

The CSI tracks changes in the severity of police-reported crime by accounting for both the amount of crime reported by police in a given jurisdiction, as well as the relative seriousness of these crimes. It tells not only how much crime is coming to the attention of police, but also how serious that crime is.

The Fort Saskatchewan Municipal Detachment's 2020 CSI value is 80.1. This is a decrease of 7.9% when compared to the 2019 CSI value of 86.9.

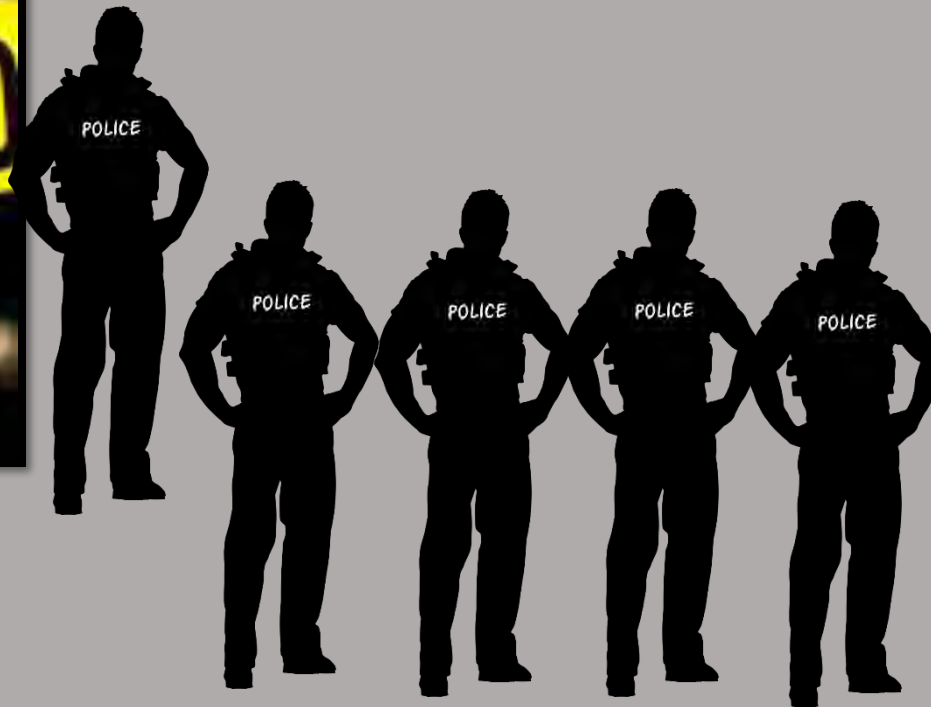

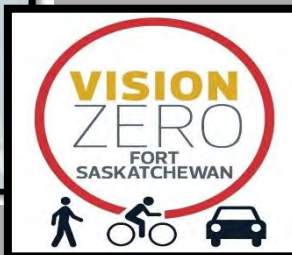
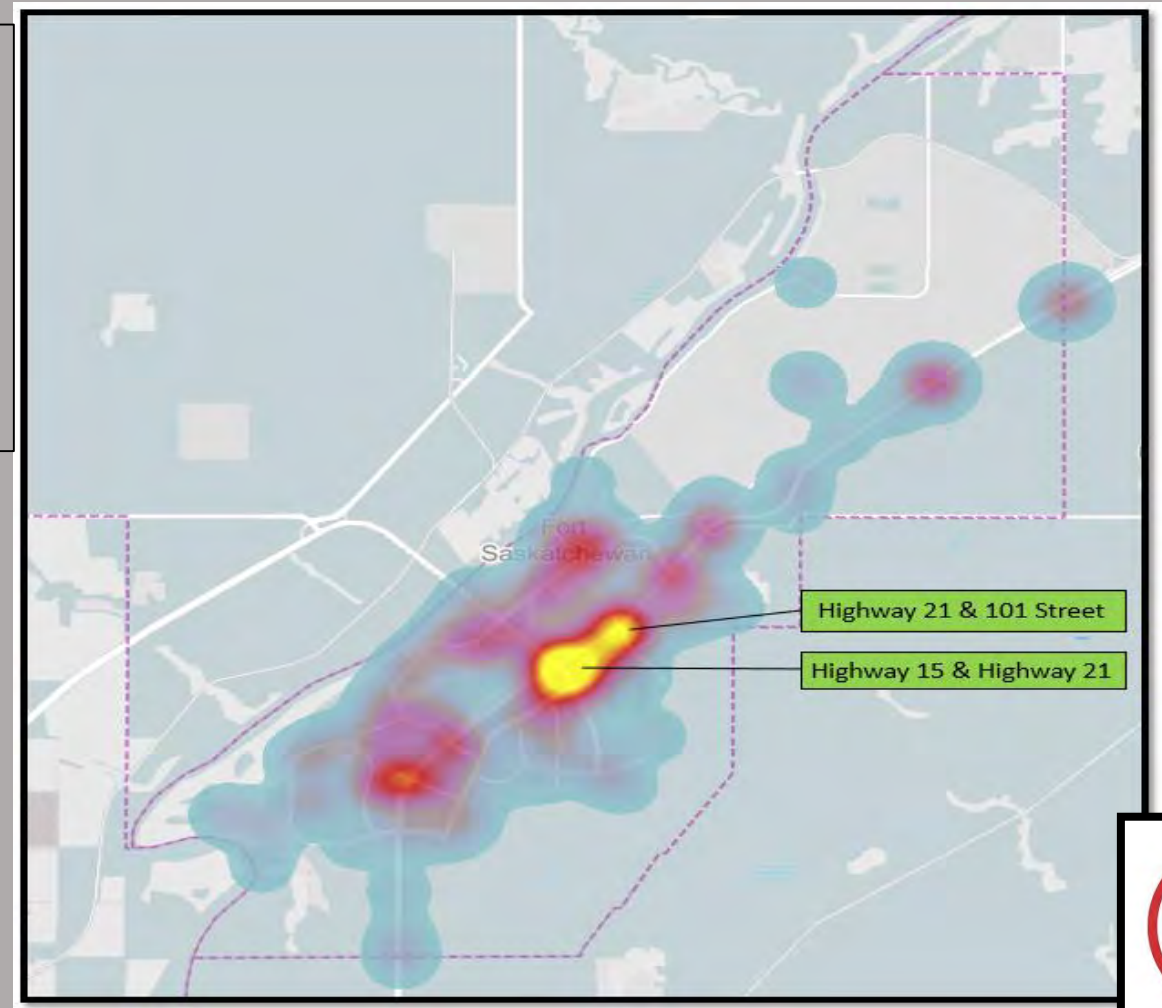


Traffic Safety

2017 - 2021

- Reported Collisions – decreased by 42%
- Vulnerable Road Users Collisions – decreased 44%
- ZERO fatalities in the City – 2021

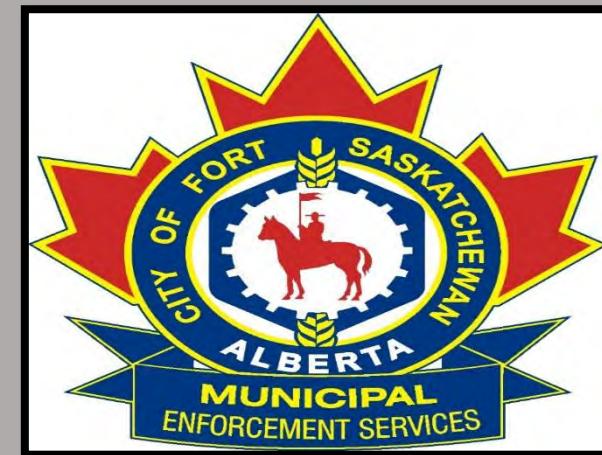

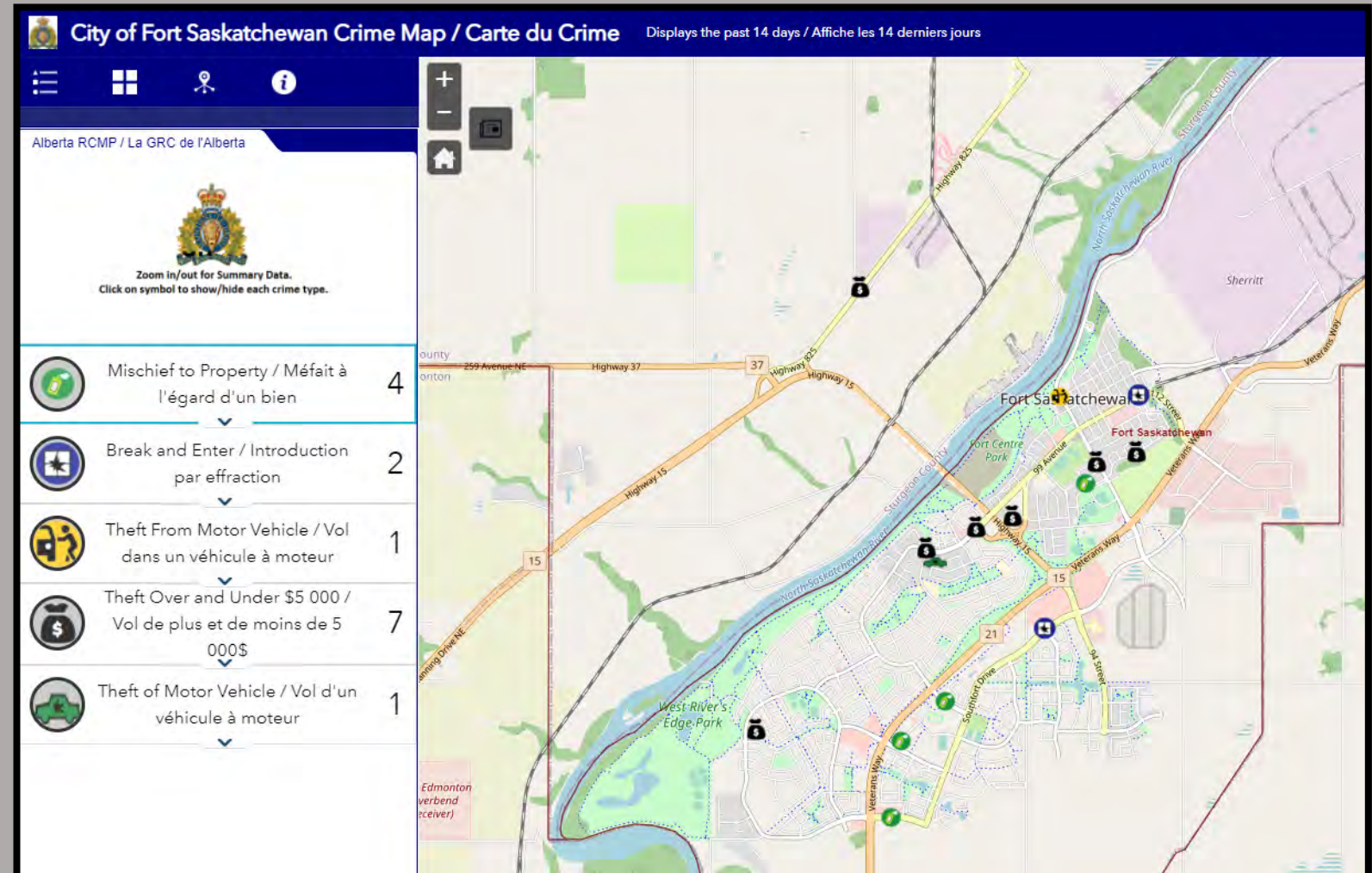
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Public Crime Map
