



## March 24, 2026 Council Meeting Highlights

### Regular Council Meeting – Open Session

#### Delegations:

#### **Item 6.1: City Entrance Signs** – Jesse Bailey – Director, Corporate Communications

Councillor Wesley moved:

- That Council approve City Entrance Sign Design Concept 2 and authorize Administration to proceed to the Detailed Construction Design phase.

#### **Item 7.1: Property Tax Penalty Waiver Roll #4624849** – Trish Norman – Coordinator, Revenue Services

Councillor Randhawa moved:

- That Council approve the waiver of late payment penalties for tax roll 4624849 in the amount of \$1,111.29.

#### **Item 7.2: Whistleblower Policy - GOV-028-C** – Andrew Kaiser – Director, Legislative Services

Councillor Blizzard moved:

- That Council approve the Whistleblower Policy GOV-028-C, as set out in Appendix A to the Request for Decision dated March 24, 2026.

While the motion was on the floor, Councillor Randhawa moved:

- That the pending motion be amended to read as follows:

That Council approve the Whistleblower Policy GOV-028-C, as set out in Appendix A to the Request for Decision dated March 24, 2026, and that no later than the end of 2026 Administration return to Council with proposed revisions to the policy which include:

1. A formalized and timely Council reporting framework outlining how whistleblower activities, trends, and outcomes will be communicated to Council while maintaining confidentiality requirements.
2. Clearer procedures and investigative processes for situations in which whistleblower complaints involve members of the Leadership Team or the City Manager, including potential escalation pathways to Council, if required.

### **Item 7.3: Motion Following Notice – Traffic Calming Infrastructure Greenfield Way – Councillor Blizzard**

Councillor Blizzard moved:

- That Administration, as part of the planning Transportation Master Plan (2026-2027), include an assessment of the effectiveness of current traffic calming infrastructure on Greenfield Way against the City's Traffic Calming Policy, and consider additional traffic calming enhancements if necessary.

While the motion was on the floor, Councillor Wesley moved:

- That the pending motion be amended to remove "against the City's Traffic Calming Policy".

### **Item 8.1: Bylaw C3-26 & C4-26 - Amend the Southfort Area Structure Plan and the SAR - Sienna Attached Residential District within the LUB - 1st Reading – Councillor Noyen**

Councillor Katchur moved:

- That Council give first reading to Bylaw C3-26 to amend the Southfort Area Structure Plan (Bylaw C8-23) to designate an area within Sienna as Medium Density Residential.

Councillor Harris moved:

- That Council give first reading to Bylaw C4-26 to amend the Land Use Bylaw (Bylaw C23-20) to:
  - a) Add section 6.26 SAR – Sienna Attached Residential District; and
  - b) Redistrict a portion of NE-20-54-22-W4M from UR – Urban Reserve to RC – Comprehensively Planned Residential District and SAR – Sienna Attached Residential District.

### **Item 9: Notice of Motion**

Councillor Katchur gave notice that at the April 14, 2026 regular council meeting they would make the following motion:

- That the Commercial Revitalization Grants program be amended to eliminate grant funds for interior improvements, including the grant stream for Commercial Improvement Grants, and so that funding is only awarded on a one-time basis per eligible business; and that Administration prepare a revised Commercial Revitalization Grants Policy and Procedure to reflect these change no later than May 27, 2026.
