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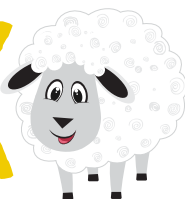

One of the most unique features in Fort Saskatchewan is the flock of fuzzy sheep roaming through our downtown core and river valley. Guided by Steinbusch family shepherds working with Border Collies, the flock of over 45 Finnsheep are woolly lawnmowers that keep our park's grass nicely trimmed.

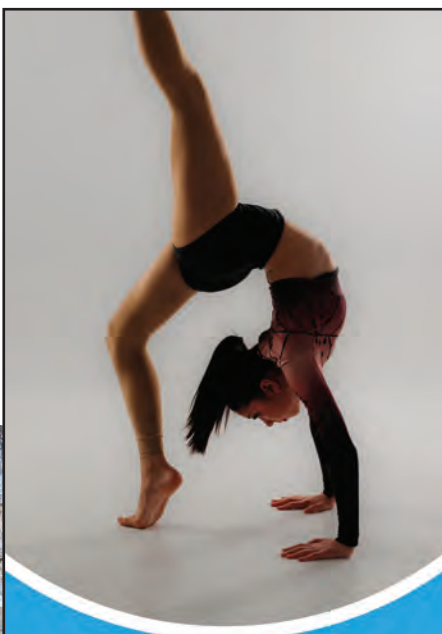

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Celebrating 150 YEARS in 2025!

This year, Fort Saskatchewan will commemorate its origins as a North-West Mounted Police (NWMP) fort established in 1875. Chosen for its strategic location, the “Fort on the Saskatchewan” quickly became a hub of law, governance, and settlement.

More than a policing post, the fort fostered community life — providing supplies, justice services, and a gathering place for early settlers. It laid the foundation for the vibrant community that would grow around it.

Today, visitors can explore a carefully reconstructed fort, offering a glimpse into the experiences of those who shaped Fort Saskatchewan’s early years.

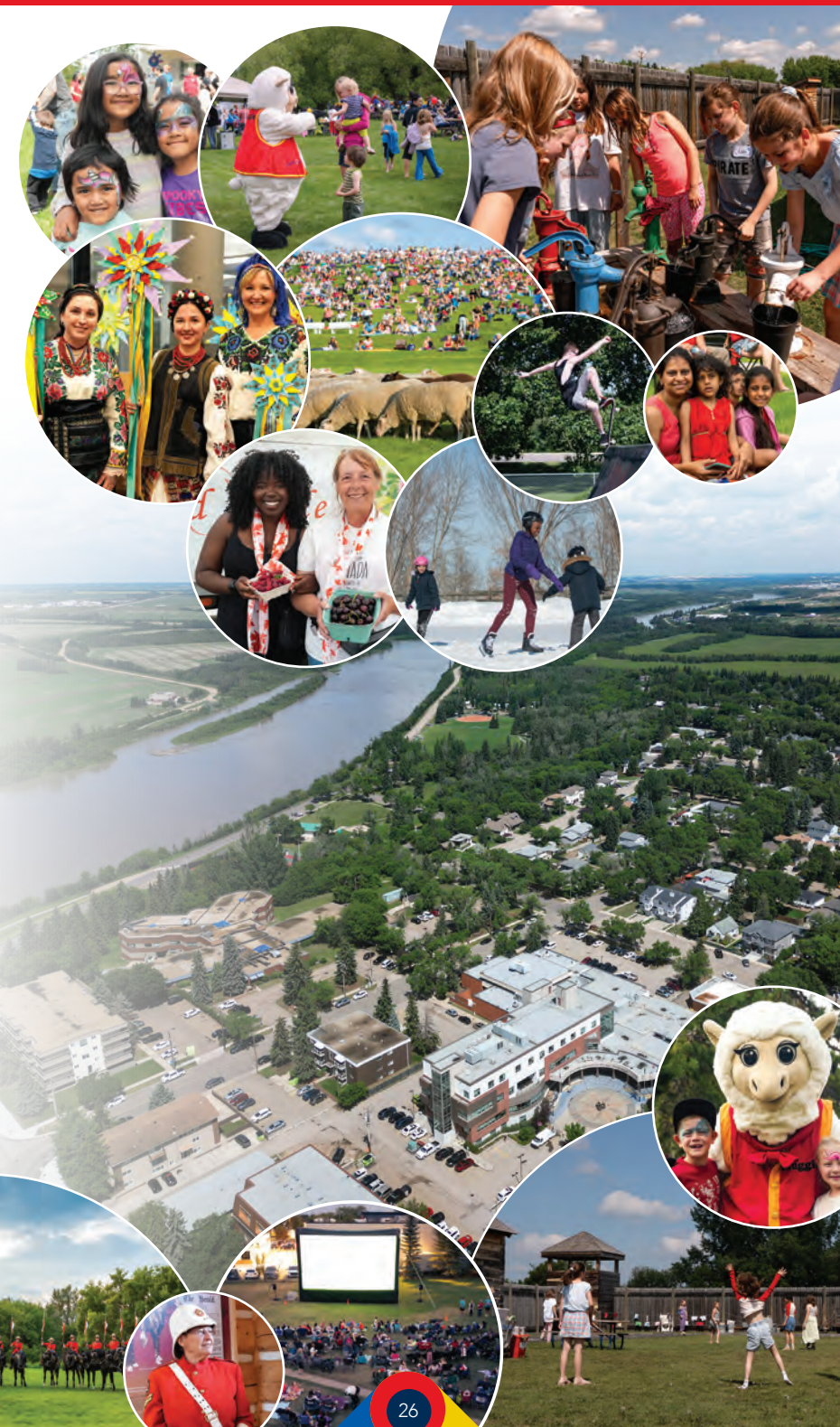

Fort Saskatchewan's 40TH ANNIVERSARY (Canada Day)

Fort Saskatchewan celebrates 40 years as a city this Canada Day, reflecting on its growth from a small town to a thriving community. Established in 1875 as a North-West Mounted Police fort, it officially be-came a city in 1985. Nestled along the North Saskatchewan River, it boasts over 80 km of scenic trails and a vibrant river valley that connects residents to nature.

Adding to its unique charm is the city’s internationally recognized flock of sheep, which roam the parks each summer, delighting visitors while providing eco-friendly lawn care. As Fort Saskatchewan marks this milestone, the Canada Day celebrations will unite the community to honour its history and look ahead to a bright future.

North Saskatchewan RIVER Valley



Interested in exploring the North Saskatchewan River by boat? Check out the Fort Saskatchewan boat launch, located near the main entrance gate to Fort Saskatchewan Prairie, a 32-acre natural preserve you can explore on foot.

The River Valley Trails run from Turner Park all the way to West River's Edge. Along the over 20 kilometres of paved trails are fabulous viewpoints and interpretive signage to entertain and inform. West River's Edge is home to the Nordic Ski Club and the Fort Saskatchewan Trail Alliance, many groomed ski trails, and the West River's Edge Pavilion.

The Fort Lions Community Fish Pond is a great spot to spend a few hours relaxing or let your kids discover the sport of fishing (provincial fishing regulations apply). If you're entertaining a four-legged friend, head to the 37-acre off-leash dog park or spend a leisurely afternoon at Chabot Park.

Lesley Macmillan Park

The city's newest park which is home to a boarded rink, basketball hoops, and a fruit tree orchard.

Centennial RCMP Park

📍 *Between 96 Avenue & 82 Street and 95 Avenue & 89 Street*

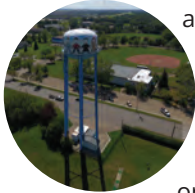

Outdoor recreation is easy to find throughout the year in Fort Saskatchewan's 1,300 acres of parks, natural areas, and green spaces. Our major parks are connected by more than 73 kilometres of paved trails, and there are 34 playgrounds spread throughout the city for families to enjoy.

Eldon Brown Park

93 Avenue, east of Sherridon Drive
With baseball diamonds and a field for soccer, football, and rugby, Eldon Brown Park has become a popular spot for people to toss a ball or watch a game.



Turner Park

From downtown, follow 101 Street to River Road
Turner Park is an 27-acre park with unbeatable scenery. Find sport fields, playgrounds, picnic tables, and fire pits throughout the park. You can reserve the picnic shelter for special events. There is also a beautiful campground run by the Fort Saskatchewan Lions Club.



Jubilee Park

Jubilee Park is the perfect place to entertain a group with diverse interests. The park has three baseball diamonds, a soccer field, and the Kinsmen playground. It's within walking distance of the Jubilee Recreation Centre, Harbour Pool, Skateboard Park, Golf & Curling Club, and the Boys & Girls Club.

Rotary Amphitheatre

Behind Fort Heritage Precinct (10006 100 Avenue)
The North Saskatchewan River valley is home to the beautiful, natural grass hillside Rotary Amphitheatre. Developed by the Fort Saskatchewan Rotary Club, the amphitheatre provides a spectacular view of the fireworks on Canada Day. It's also where you'll find our City's biggest tobogganing hill for winter fun.

Skateboard Park

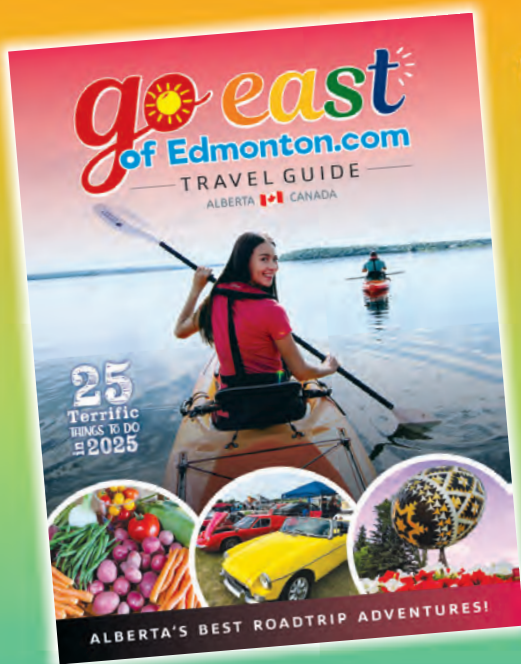

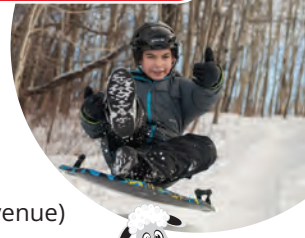

- Windsor Point (access at Wingate Way)



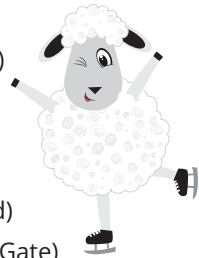
Ice Slide
