



April 14, 2026 Council Meeting Highlights

Regular Council Meeting – Open Session

Item 6.1: Procurement Policy Options – Sandy Bugeja – General Manager, Corporate Services

Councillor Katchur moved:

- That Council direct Administration to proceed with Option 3, as set out in the April 14, 2026 Request for Decision report, and that by the end of 2026, Administration return to Council to resume consideration of potential amendments to the City's procurement policy.

Carried 4 – 3 (In favour: Councillors Katchur, Harris, Wesley and Randhawa // Opposed: Mayor Makin and Councillors Noyen and Blizzard)

Item 6.2: Motion Following Notice – Commercial Revitalization Grants Program – Councillor Gale Katchur

Councillor Katchur moved:

- That the Commercial Revitalization Grants program be amended to eliminate grant funds for interior improvements, including the grant stream for Commercial Improvement Grants, and so that funding is only awarded on a one-time basis per eligible business; and that Administration prepare a revised Commercial Revitalization Grants Policy and Procedure to reflect these change no later than May 27, 2026.

Carried 5 – 2 (In favour: Councillors Katchur, Harris, Wesley, Blizzard and Randhawa // Opposed: Mayor Makin and Councillor Noyen)

Item 7.1: Bylaw C15-26 – Road Closure (Portion of Road Plan 042 1351 Right of Way) – 1st Reading – Taran Samra – Planner I

Councillor Blizzard moved:

- That Council give first reading to Bylaw C15-26 to close a portion of Road Plan 042 1351 Right-of-Way, and further that a Public Hearing be scheduled for May 12, 2026.

Carried Unanimously

Item 7.2: Bylaw C8-26 – Amend the Land Use Bylaw to redistrict land within Roseburn – 1st Reading – Scott Purich – Planner I

Councillor Noyen moved:

- That That Council give first reading to Bylaw C8-26 to amend Land Use Bylaw C23-20 to:
 - a) redistrict a portion of NE-18-54-22-W4M from AG-S – Agricultural General South to PR – Parks and Recreation District.and further that a Public Hearing be scheduled for May 12, 2026.

Carried Unanimously
